Moscow in Figures

POPULATION

1600 c 100,000 1900 1,000,000 1995 9,000,000

- · Moscow is now the largest city in Europe
- At any one time there are up to 1 million unregistered Muscovites living in the city

LOCATION

- On the flat Central European plains (average height 156m above sea level)
- At 37° 34 minutes longtitude and 37° 37 minutes north latitude, parallel with Copenhagen, Denmark and Grand Prairie, Canada,
- Moscow Sheremetevo airport is 1,627km from Berlin, 2,000km from Paris, 2,507km from London, 6,170km from Khabarovsk (Siberia) and 8,200km from New York

GREATER MOSCOW

- The metropolitan area covers 879 sq km, stretching 40km from north to south and 35km from east to west
- · The ring road encircles the city for 109km
- The River Moskva flows through greater Moscow; its total length is 502km
- 41 bridges cross the Moskva River and its canals; 29 bridges span the River Yauza and its tributaries

CAPITAL CITY

- At the time of going to press there are: 75 government agencies, at least 20 registered political parties, 124 foreign embassies, plus 11 permanent representatives of CIS states
- at least 50 newspapers published in Moscow
- at least 950 foreign businesses in Moscow
- 32 theatres with permanent companies
- over 100 commercial art galleries
- more than 400 cafés and restaurants
- 11 cathedrals (12 when the Cathedral of the Saviour reopens in 1997)
- more than 100 museums
- 18 'children's parks'
- 16 'forest parks' and beaches
- 12 country estates
- 27 'parks of culture and recreation'

Moscow People

ANDREY KNISHEV

One of Russian TV's most promising satirists, Knishev is best known for his show Funny Guys, which made fun of the chaotic, at times anarchic programming on national television, not least the commercial breaks, a concept still in its infancy over here. The show turned Knishev into a household name and has led to the commissioning of a new series, Serious Men. A writer as well as a TV presenter, Andrey not only signs copies of his books but sells them, too ('needs must' in today's Russia). He began his career as a journalist on the provocative youth paper, Moskovskiy Komsomolets, and is destined to go far.

THE GORBACHEVS

Mikhail and Raisa Gorbachev now live in a government dacha at Kalchuga on the banks of the Moskva River. The former Soviet leader has recently completed a barnstorming tour of Russia and there is even talk of a political comeback. In the meantime both Mikhail and Raisa are actively involved in the work of the Gorbachev Foundation. This institute on Leningradskiy prospekt provides financial support for a wide range of economic initiatives, but has also raised a great deal of money for charity; for example, \$1,400,000 for a Moscow cancer hospital which helps leukemia victims of the Chernobyl disaster.

ALEXANDER SOLZHENITSYN

The homecoming in 1994 of the world-renowned Russian author was as much a media event as his enforced departure 20 years earlier. A survivor of the Gulag (the Soviet forced-labour camps), Solzhenitsyn famously turned his bitter experiences to account with the novel One Day in the Life of Ivan Denisovich. His other works, notably The Gulag Archipelago, earned him the Nobel Prize in 1970. Solzhenitsyn now sees his role as helping the Russian people through the present crisis: 'I try to keep all of Russia's problems in my head.' He is currently living in a Moscow apartment while awaiting the completion of a large house on the outskirts of the city.

One of Moscow's leading fashion designers, Zaitsev now has an international reputation stretching throughout Europe, the United States and Japan. Slava puts this success down entirely to his own talents: Throughout my life no one has given me any help. Everything I have today is the result of my own efforts.' A colourful figure, who paints and writes poetry when he is not designing clothes, he imbues his creations with a theatricality quite his own. Once a designer with the House of Fashion on Kuznetskiy Most, he now has his own salon and dothes store on Prospekt Mira.
